While at the U.S. Army Disciplinary Training Center (DTC) in Pisa (in May 1945), Pound spent 3 weeks in an **outdoor steel cage**. His belt and shoelaces were confiscated (per standard procedure), and he was kept in isolation.


The temperature records for Pisa during Pound's cage time: the highest daytime temperature recorded was 87 degrees Fahrenheit (30.5 degrees Celsius), the low was 48 degrees Fahrenheit (8.8 degrees Celsius). The top of the cage was covered with tarpaper for shade, and Pound was given a few blankets.


Apparently, Pound suffered most from the heat, dust and ceaseless glare. After a week or so, Pound's physical and mental state became increasingly fragile. After three weeks he was removed to a tent and provided with a cot and a few other comforts, including reading material.

During this incarceration Pound wrote a draft of *The Pisan Cantos.* The discovery of a few stanzas written on toilet paper suggest that he started writing while still in his cage.








Ezra Pound five days after his admission to St Elizabeth's Hospital.

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




Toilet paper showing the beginning of Ezra Pound's *The Pisan Cantos*.


